> Reagan and Nancy Davis. We sang "Hang Down Your Head, Tom Dooley" with the Kingston Trio and watched Hitch's 'Vertigo,' 'Cat on a Hot Tin Roof,' 'Auntie Mame,' 'Gigi,' Orson Welles' 'Touch of Evil,' 'South Pacific' and Academy-Award winner 'Bridge on the River Kwai.'
