Between 23 and 30, a woman is like Europe: well developed and open to trade, especially for someone of real value.

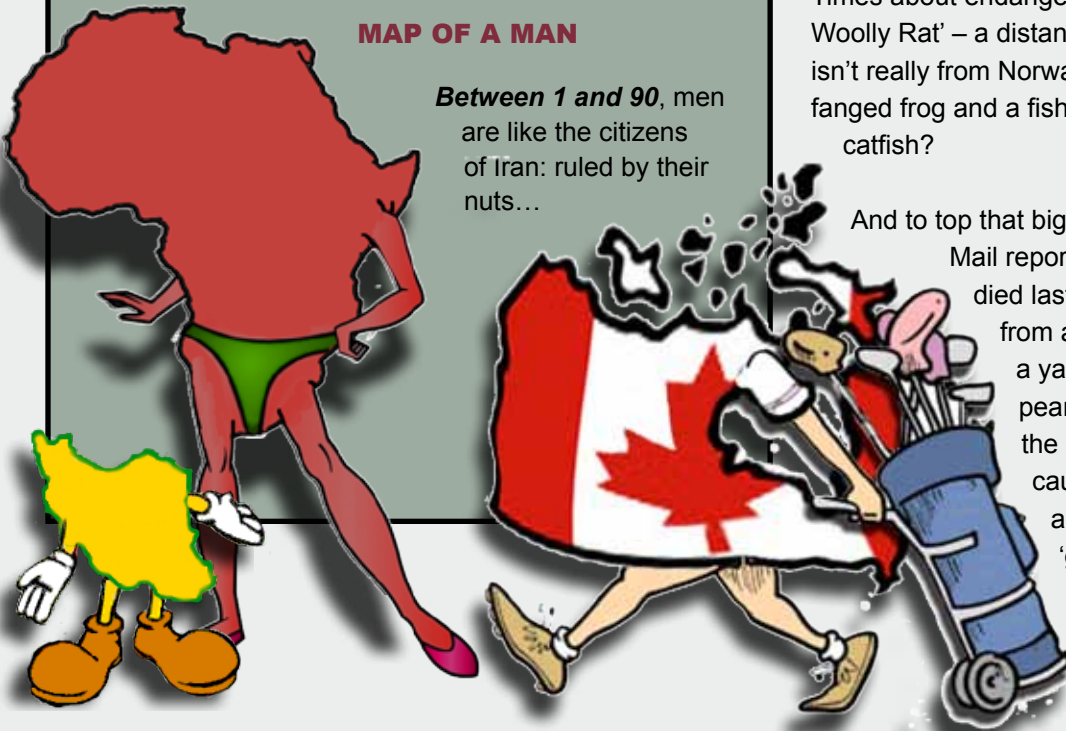
