## **A CARBON PAWPRINT**

In the new book *Time to Eat the Dog: The Real Guide to Sustainable Living* by Robert and Brenda Vale, specialists in the topic at New Zealand's Victoria University of Wellington, it's claimed that a medium-sized canine wolfs down 360 pounds of meat and 250 pounds of cereal annually, leaving behind a footprint of 2.07 acres – twice the tread marks of a Hummer driving 6,200 miles a year, including the energy expended to build (and sell?) the car.

But kitties aren't much better! Pussies leave an eco-print just "slightly less than driving a Volkswagen Golf for a year. And two hamsters are equal to a plasma television showing a Disney film while even a humble goldfish burns energy "equivalent to two mobile telephones," states the article in the *Vancouver Sun*. (And while we're on the subject, the most common name for a pet goldfish is "Jaws.")

Furthermore, cats and dogs "devastate wildlife, spread disease and pollute waterways," the Vales say. For example, 7.7 million British felines hunt and eat an average of 25 birds, mammals and frogs per cat, or 188 million innocent critters. Likewise, dogs decrease biodiversity in areas where they're walked, while their poop pollutes waterways and kills aquatic life. And cat crap is even more toxic. (Tell me about it!) And flushing litter down the loo can infect adorable sea otters with toxoplasma gondii (no relation to Mahatma), leading to brain disease.

But, counters Reha Huttin, President of France's largest animal rights organization, "Pets are anti-depressants, they help us cope with stress, and they are good for the elderly. I walk instead of using my car," she adds. "And I don't eat meat, so why shouldn't I be allowed to have a little cat to alleviate my loneliness?"

And solutions do exist, such as curbing a pet's protein-rich diet. "If a cat is fed on fish heads and other leftovers from the fishmonger," suggest the Vales, "the impact will be lower." But the best way of offsetting a pet-print is to cohabit with "dualpurpose companions" like hens, which supply eggs, or bunny rabbits -- "provided you eat them," adds Vale. **READ MORE**
